Messiah

Isaiah 50

1 This is what the Lord says:

"Where is your mother's certificate of divorce with which I sent her away? Or to which of my creditors did I sell you?

Because of your sins you were sold;

because of your transgressions your mother was sent away.

2 When I came, why was there no one?

When I called, why was there no one to answer?

Was my arm too short to deliver you?

Do I lack the strength to rescue you?

By a mere rebuke I dry up the sea,

I turn rivers into a desert;

their fish rot for lack of water

and die of thirst.

3 I clothe the heavens with darkness and make sackcloth its covering."

4 The Sovereign Lord has given me a well-instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary.

He wakens me morning by morning,

wakens my ear to listen like one being instructed.

5 The Sovereign Lord has opened my ears;

I have not been rebellious.

I have not turned away.

6 I offered my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who pulled out my beard;

I did not hide my face

from mocking and spitting.

7 Because the Sovereign Lord helps me,

I will not be disgraced.

Therefore have I set my face like flint,

and I know I will not be put to shame.

8 He who vindicates me is near.

Who then will bring charges against me?

Let us face each other!

Who is my accuser?

Let him confront me!

9 It is the Sovereign Lord who helps me.

Who will condemn me?

They will all wear out like a garment;

the moths will eat them up.

10 Who among you fears the Lord and obeys the word of his servant?

Let the one who walks in the dark, who has no light, trust in the name of the Lord and rely on their God.

11 But now, all you who light fires and provide yourselves with flaming torches, go, walk in the light of your fires and of the torches you have set ablaze. This is what you shall receive from my hand: You will lie down in torment.

Isaiah 53

1 Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?
2 He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground.
He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.

- 3 He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.
- 4 Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.
- **5** But he was <u>pierced for our transgressions</u>, he was crushed for our iniquities; <u>the punishment that brought us peace was on him</u>, and by his wounds we are healed.
- **6** We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- **7** He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth;

he was led <u>like a lamb</u> to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

8 By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished.

9 He was assigned a **grave** with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.

10 Yet it was the Lord's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the Lord makes his life an offering for sin, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in his hand.

11 After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.

12 Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because **he poured out his life unto death**, and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Isaiah 9:1-6

1 Nevertheless, there will be no more gloom for those who were in distress. In the past he humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in the future he will honor Galilee of the nations, by the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan—

2 The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.3 You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you

as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder. 4 For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders. the rod of their oppressor. **5** Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire. 6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, **Everlasting** Father, Prince of Peace.

Jeremiah 31:31-34

31 "The days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. 32 It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them," declares the Lord. 33 "This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the Lord. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. **34** No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me,

from the least of them to the greatest," declares the Lord.
"For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

John 12:37-43

37 Even after Jesus had performed so many signs in their presence, they still would not believe in him.**38** This was to fulfill the word of Isaiah the prophet: "Lord, who has believed our message

and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

39 For this reason they could not believe, because, as Isaiah says elsewhere:

40 "He has blinded their eyes

and hardened their hearts,

so they can neither see with their eyes,

nor understand with their hearts,

nor turn-and I would heal them."

41 Isaiah said this because he saw Jesus' glory and spoke about him.

42 Yet at the same time many even among the leaders believed in him. But because of the Pharisees they would not openly acknowledge their faith for fear they would be put out of the synagogue; **43** for they loved human praise more than praise from God.

Galatians 3:6-14 (Children of Abraham)

6 So also Abraham "believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." 7 Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham. 8 Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: "All nations will be blessed through you." 9 So those who rely on faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith. 10 For all who rely on the works of the law are under a curse, as it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law." 11 Clearly no one who relies on the law is justified before God, because "the righteous will live by faith." 12 The law is not based on faith; on the contrary, it says, "The person who does these things will live by them." 13 Christ redeemed us from the curse of the

law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a pole." **14** He redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that <u>by faith</u> we might receive the promise of the Spirit.

Galatians 3:17-19 (The Law came after the promise)

17 What I mean is this: The law, introduced 430 years later, does not set aside the covenant previously established by God and thus do away with the promise. 18 For if the inheritance depends on the law, then it no longer depends on the promise; but God in his grace gave it to Abraham through a promise. 19 Why, then, was the law given at all? It was added because of transgressions until the Seed to whom the promise referred had come. The law was given through angels and entrusted to a mediator.

Hebrews 8:7-12

7 For if there had been nothing wrong with that first covenant, no place would have been sought for another.8 But God found fault with the people and said

"The days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant

with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah.

9 It will not be like the covenant
I made with their ancestors
when I took them by the hand
to lead them out of Egypt,
because they did not remain faithful to my covenant,
and I turned away from them,
declares the Lord.

10 This is the covenant I will establish with the people of Israel after that time, declares the Lord.

I will put my laws in their minds and write them on their hearts.

I will be their God, and they will be my people.

11 No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me,

from the least of them to the greatest.

12 For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

Genesis 3:14-15 (descendent)

14 So the Lord God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, "Cursed are you above all livestock and all wild animals!
You will crawl on your belly and you will eat dust all the days of your life.
15 And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Hosea 6:6 (God desires a heart that searches for him, not sacrifice)

For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings.

Psalm 118:26-27

26 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. From the house of the Lord we bless you.

27 The Lord is God, and he has made his light shine on us.

With boughs in hand, join in the festal procession up to the horns of the altar.

Matthews 27:35 (Clothes)

When they had crucified him, they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

Mark 15:24 (Clothes)

And they crucified him. Dividing up his clothes, they cast lots to see what each would get.

Luke 23:34 (Clothes)

Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

John 19:23-24 (Clothes)

23 When the soldiers crucified Jesus, they took his clothes, dividing them into four shares, one for each of them, with the undergarment remaining. This garment was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom.

24 "Let's not tear it," they said to one another. "Let's decide by lot who will get it."

This happened that the scripture might be fulfilled that said,

"They divided my clothes among them and cast lots for my garment."
So this is what the soldiers did.

Psalm 22:18 (Clothes)

They divide my clothes among them and cast lots for my garment.

John 19:31-37 (bones and side piercing)

31 Now it was the day of Preparation, and the next day was to be a special Sabbath. Because the Jewish leaders did not want the bodies left on the crosses during the Sabbath, they asked Pilate to have the legs broken and the bodies taken down.32 The soldiers therefore came and broke the legs of the first man who had been crucified with Jesus, and then those of the other.33 But when they came to Jesus and found that he was already dead, they did not break his legs.34 Instead, one of the soldiers pierced Jesus' side with a spear, bringing a sudden flow of blood and water.35 The man who saw it has given testimony, and his testimony is true. He knows that he tells the truth, and he testifies so that you also may believe.36 These things happened so that the scripture would be fulfilled: "Not one of his bones will be broken," 37 and, as another scripture says, "They will look on the one they have pierced."

They **must not** leave any of it till morning or **break any of its bones**. When they celebrate the Passover, they must follow all the regulations.

11 and to <u>make it your ambition</u> to lead a quiet life: You should mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we told you, 12 so that your daily life may win the respect of outsiders and so that you will not be dependent on anybody.

Food, Sabbath, Festivals, Sacrifices

Romans 14:1-6 (Food/Sabbath)

1 Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarreling over disputable matters. 2 One person's faith allows them to eat anything, but another, whose faith is weak, eats only vegetables. 3 The one who eats everything must not treat with contempt the one who does not, and the one who does not eat everything must not judge the one who does, for God has accepted them. 4 Who are you to judge someone else's servant? To their own master, servants stand or fall. And they will stand, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

5 One person considers one day more sacred than another; another

considers every day alike. Each of them should be fully convinced in their own mind.6 Whoever regards one day as special does so to the Lord. Whoever eats meat does so to the Lord, for they give thanks to God; and whoever abstains does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God.

Romans 14:17-23 (Heart that does not condemn itself – ONLY for some issues)

17For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit, 18 because anyone who serves Christ in this way is pleasing to God and receives human approval. 19 Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification. 20 Do not destroy the work of God for the sake of food. All food is clean, but it is wrong for a person to eat anything that causes someone else to stumble. 21 It is better not to eat meat or drink wine or to do anything else that will cause your brother or sister to fall. 22 So whatever you believe about these things keep between yourself and God. Blessed is the one who does not condemn himself by what he approves.23 But whoever has doubts is condemned if they eat, because their eating is not from faith; and everything that does not come from faith is sin.

Colossians 2:16 (Festival)

Therefore <u>do not let anyone judge you</u> by what you eat or drink, or with regard to a religious festival, a New Moon celebration or a Sabbath day.

Isaiah 1:11 (Sacrifices)

"The multitude of your sacrifices—
what are they to me?" says the Lord.
"I have more than enough of burnt offerings,
of rams and the fat of fattened animals;
I have no pleasure
in the blood of bulls and lambs and goats.

Isaiah 1:13-14 (Sacrifices)

13 Stop bringing meaningless offerings! Your incense is detestable to me.

New Moons, Sabbaths and convocations—
I cannot bear your worthless assemblies.

14 Your New Moon feasts and your appointed festivals
I hate with all my being.

They have become a burden to me;
I am weary of bearing them.

Psalm 50:14 (Sacrifices)

"Sacrifice thank offerings to God, fulfill your vows to the Most High,

Psalm 50:23 (Sacrifices)

Those who sacrifice thank offerings **honor me**, and to the blameless I will show my salvation."

Psalm 51:16-17 (Sacrifices)

16 You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings.
17 My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise.

Matthew 12:1-12 (Sabbath)

1 At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath. His disciples were hungry and began to pick some heads of grain and eat them.2 When the Pharisees saw this, they said to him, "Look! Your disciples are doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath." 3 He answered, "Haven't you read what David did when he and his companions were hungry? 4 He entered the house of God, and he and his companions ate the consecrated bread—which was not lawful for them to do, but only for the priests. 5 Or haven't you read in the Law that the priests on Sabbath duty in the temple desecrate the Sabbath and yet are innocent? 6 I tell you that something greater than the temple is here. 7 If you had known what these words mean, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the innocent. 8 For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath." 9 Going on from that place, he went into their synagogue, 10 and a man with a shriveled hand

was there. Looking for a reason to bring charges against Jesus, they asked him, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?" 11 He said to them, "If any of you has a sheep and it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will you not take hold of it and lift it out?12 How much more valuable is a person than a sheep! Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath."

Law of Moses x Grace

Romans 10:4 (The culmination of the law is Christ)

Christ is the culmination of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

Galatians 2:19-21 (Righteousness is gained by grace and not through the law)

19 "For through the law <u>I died to the law</u> so that I might live for God.20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.21 <u>I do not set aside the grace of God</u>, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!"

Romans 8:-14 (There is no condemnation...)

1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus,2 because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.3 For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh,4 in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Baptism

I Peter 3:21 (Clear conscience. So, the person needs to be conscious of that) and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ,

Wisdom, creation

I Corinthians 1:18-25

18 For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.**19** For it is written:

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise;

the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."

20 Where is the wise person? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? 21 For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe. 22 Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, 23 but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, 24 but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. 25 For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

I Corinthians 2:6-16

6 We do, however, speak a message of wisdom among the mature, but not the wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. **7** No, we declare God's wisdom, a mystery that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began. **8** None of the rulers of this age understood it, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. **9** However, as it is written:

"What no eye has seen, what no ear has heard, and what no human mind has conceived"—

the things God has prepared for those who love him-

10 these are the things God has revealed to us by his Spirit.

The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God.11 For who knows a person's thoughts except their own spirit within them? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God.12 What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us.13 This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, explaining spiritual realities with Spirit-taught words.14 The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness, and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit.15 The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments,

16 for,

"Who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?"

But we have the mind of Christ.

I Corinthians 3:18-23

18 Do not deceive yourselves. If any of you think you are wise by the standards of this age, you should become "fools" so that you may become wise.19 For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in God's sight. As it is written: "He catches the wise in their craftiness";20 and again, "The Lord knows that the thoughts of the wise are futile."21 So then, no more boasting about human leaders! All things are yours,22 whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all are yours,23 and you are of Christ, and Christ is of God.

Romans 1:18-22

18 The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of people, who suppress the truth by their wickedness, **19** since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. **20** For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.

21 For <u>although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God</u> nor gave thanks to him, but their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened.**22** Although they claimed to be wise, <u>they became fools</u>

About the creation of the world and humanity

Genesis 1:3 (First day)

And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light.

Genesis 1:6 (Second day)

And <u>God said</u>, "Let there be a vault between the waters to separate water from water."

Genesis 1:11 (Third day)

Then <u>God said</u>, "Let the land produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and trees on the land that bear fruit with seed in it, according to their various kinds." And it was so.

Genesis 1:14-15 (Fourth day)

14 And <u>God said</u>, "Let there be lights in the vault of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them serve as signs to mark sacred times, and days and years, **15** and let them be lights in the vault of the sky to give light on the earth." **And it was so**.

Genesis 1:20-21 (Fifth day)

20 And God said, "Let the water teem with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the vault of the sky." **21** So God created the great creatures of the sea and every living thing with which the water teems and that moves about in it, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good.

Genesis 1:24-26 (Sixth day; and evidences of the trinity)

24 And God said, "Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: the livestock, the creatures that move along the ground, and the wild animals, each according to its kind." And it was so.25 God made the wild animals according to their kinds, the livestock according to their kinds, and all the creatures that move along the ground according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good.

26 Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness,

so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

27 So God <u>created</u> mankind in his <u>own</u> image,

in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

Hebrews 11:3

By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

Hebrews 11:1

Now <u>faith is</u> confidence in what we hope for and <u>assurance about what we</u> <u>do not see</u>.

Hebrews 4:3

Now we who have believed enter that rest, just as God has said,

"So I declared on oath in my anger,

'They shall never enter my rest.'"

And yet his works have been **finished** since the creation of the world.

Romans 4:17

As it is written: "I have made you a father of many nations." He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed—the God who gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not.

Acts 17:26-31 (From one man he made all; appointed the boundaries of lands)

26 <u>From one man</u> he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the <u>boundaries</u> of their lands.27 God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us.28 'For in him we live and move and have our being.'As some of your own poets have said, 'We are his offspring.'

29 "Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone—an image made by human design and skill.30 In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent.31 For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to everyone by raising him from the dead."

Time since the creation

Luke 3:23-38 (Genealogy of Jesus)

Luke 11:50-51

50 Therefore this generation will be held responsible for the blood of all the prophets that has been shed since the beginning of the world, **51** from the blood of Abel to the blood of Zechariah, who was killed between the altar and the sanctuary. Yes, I tell you, this generation will be held responsible for it all.

One day, one thousand years

Note.: In Genesis it is described what was created by God each day; and says there was "evening and morning" between each of these days. So, were days of 24 hours (cannot be interpreted as a thousand years. All things were actually created in 6 days)

And God rested on the seventh day (Saturday) and blessed this day. If these days were a thousand years each, then God would have rested a thousand years; and every Sabbath should take a thousand years.

II Peter 3:8

But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day.

Psalm 90:4

A thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night.

Family of Jesus

Matthew 13:55 (Name of his brothers)

"Isn't this the carpenter's son? Isn't his mother's name Mary, and aren't his brothers James, Joseph, Simon and Judas?

Mateus 13:56 (He also had sisters)

Aren't all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all these things?"

Mother of Jesus

Mark 3:31-35 (It is more important to do God's will)

- **31** Then Jesus' mother and brothers arrived. Standing outside, they sent someone in to call him.**32** A crowd was sitting around him, and they told him, "Your mother and brothers are outside looking for you."
- 33 "Who are my mother and my brothers?" he asked.
- **34** Then he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! **35** Whoever does God's will is my brother and sister and mother."

Matthew 12:46-50 (Again, written in Matthew)

46 While Jesus was still talking to the crowd, his mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to speak to him.**47** Someone told him, "Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you."

48 He replied to him, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?"**49** Pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers.**50** For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."

Luke 8:19-21 (Again, written in Luke)

19 Now Jesus' mother and brothers came to see him, but they were not able to get near him because of the crowd.**20** Someone told him, "Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to see you."

21 <u>He replied, "My mother and brothers are those who hear God's word and put it into practice."</u>

Gifts

I Corinthians 12, 13, 14.

I Corinthians 13:1

If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal.

Romans 12:3-8

3 For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. **4** For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, **5** so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. **6** We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. Psalm 149:1 (New song)

Praise the Lord.
Sing to the Lord a new song,
his praise in the assembly of his faithful people.

Psalm 63:4 (Lift up my hands)

I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name I will lift up my hands.

Psalm 149:3 (Dance, instruments)

Let them praise his name with dancing and make music to him with timbrel and harp.

Psalm 150:3-5 (Dance, instruments)

3 Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre,
4 praise him with timbrel and dancing, praise him with the strings and pipe,
5 praise him with the clash of cymbals, praise him with resounding cymbals.

Psalm 150:6 (everything that has breath)

6 Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord.

Love of God

Romans 5:8

But <u>God demonstrates his own love for us in this:</u> While we were <u>still</u> sinners, Christ died for us.

Loving God

John 14:15

"If you love me, keep my commands.

John 14:21

Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them."

John 14:23-24

23 Jesus replied, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them.24 Anyone who does not love me will not obey my teaching. These words you hear are not my own; they belong to the Father who sent me.

45 But suppose the servant says to himself, 'My master is taking a long time in coming,' and he then begins to beat the other servants, both men and women, and to eat and drink and get drunk.**46** The master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he is not aware of. He will cut him to pieces and assign him a place with the unbelievers.

Have God in the heart

Ephesians 3:17

so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love,

Ephesians 2:21-22

21 In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord.22 And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

God keeps us safe; the evil one cannot harm us

I John 5:18 (Jesus keeps us safe; the evil one cannot harm us)

We know that anyone born of God does not continue to sin; the One who was born of God keeps them safe, and the evil one cannot harm them.

II Thessalonians 3:3

But the Lord is faithful, and he will strengthen you and <u>protect you</u> from the evil one.

Self-control

Galatians 5:22-23

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, <u>forbearance</u>, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, **23** gentleness and <u>self-control</u>. Against such things there is no law

II Peter 1:5-7

5 For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; **6** and to knowledge, **self-control**; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; **7** and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love.

I Peter 4:7

The end of all things is near. Therefore be alert and of sober mind so that you may pray

Matthew 12:36

God looks at the heart

I Samuel 16:7

Do not be yoked together with unbelievers

II Corinthians 6:14-18

14 Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?**15** What harmony is there between Christ and Belial? Or what does a believer have in common with an unbeliever?**16** What agreement is there between the temple of God and idols? For we are the temple of the living God. As God has said:

"I will live with them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they will be my people."

17 Therefore,
"Come out from them and be separate, says the Lord.
Touch no unclean thing, and I will receive you."

18 And,
"I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

Bad company

I Corinthians 15:33

Do not be misled: "Bad company corrupts good character."

Oath

Matthew 5:33-37

33 "Again, you have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not break your oath, but fulfill to the Lord the vows you have made.'34 But I tell you, do not swear an oath at all: either by heaven, for it is God's throne;35 or by the earth, for it is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the Great King.36 And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make even one hair white or black.37 All you need to say is simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one

James 5:12

Above all, my brothers and sisters, <u>do not swear</u>—not by heaven or by earth <u>or by anything else</u>. All you need to say is a simple "Yes" or "No." Otherwise you will be condemned.

Having mercy

James 2:13

because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

Love your neighbor

Galatians 5:14 (For the entire law is fulfilled in...)

<u>For the entire law is fulfilled in</u> keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Leviticus 19:18 (Love your neighbor – Old Testament)

"Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord.

Humbleness

I Peter 5:5

In the same way, you who are younger, submit yourselves to your elders. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."

Proverbs 3:34

He mocks proud mockers but shows favor to the humble and oppressed.

James 4:6

But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."

Submit to the authorities

Romans 13:1-7

1 Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.2 Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves.3 For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and you will be commended.4 For the one in authority is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for rulers do not bear the sword for no reason. They are God's servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer.5 Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience.

6 This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. **7** Give to everyone what you owe them: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor.

I Peter 2:13-14

13 Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, **14** or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right.

II Peter 2:10-11

10 This is especially true of those who follow the corrupt desire of the flesh and despise authority.

Bold and arrogant, they are not afraid to heap abuse on celestial beings;11 yet even angels, although they are stronger and more powerful, do not heap abuse on such beings when bringing judgment on them from the Lord.

Jude 8

In the very same way, on the strength of their dreams these ungodly people pollute their own bodies, reject authority and heap abuse on celestial beings

Ecclesiastes 8:4-5

4 Since a king's word is supreme, who can say to him, "What are you doing?" **5** Whoever obeys his command will come to no harm, and the wise heart will know the proper time and procedure.

Helping the poor

Deuteronomy 15:11

There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore I command you to be openhanded toward your fellow Israelites who are poor and needy in your land.

Money

II Peter 2:3

In their greed these teachers will exploit you with fabricated stories. Their condemnation has long been hanging over them, and their destruction has not been sleeping.

II Corinthians 2:17

Unlike so many, we do not peddle the word of God for profit. On the contrary, in Christ we speak before God with sincerity, as those sent from God.

Luke 12:15

Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against <u>all kinds</u> of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."

Flee

I Corinthians 6:18 (Sexual immorality)

<u>Flee</u> from sexual immorality. All other sins a person commits are outside the body, but whoever sins sexually, sins against their own body.

I Corinthians 10:14 (Idolatry)

Therefore, my dear friends, flee from idolatry.

I Timothy 6:11

But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness.

Resist

James 4:7

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

Peace of Christ

Colossians 3:15 (rule in your heart)

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful.

Philippians 4:7

And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Sorrow

II Corinthians 7:10

Godly sorrow <u>brings repentance that leads to salvation</u> and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.

Do not be afraid

Psalm 56:3

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you.

Psalm 56:11

in God I trust and am not afraid. What can man do to me?

Having care and refuge in God

Psalm 121:8 (God watch over your coming and going)

the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.

Psalm 91:2 (God is my refuge)

I will say of the Lord, "He is my **refuge** and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."

Psalm 61:2-3 (rock higher than I)

2 From the ends of the earth I call to you, I call as my heart grows faint;
lead me to the rock that is higher than I.
3 For you have been my refuge,
a strong tower against the foe.

Psalm 61:4 (refuge in the shelter of your wings)

I long to dwell in your tent forever and take refuge in the shelter of your wings.

Psalm 62:6-7 (rock, salvation and refuge)

6 Truly he is my rock and my salvation;
he is my fortress, I will not be shaken.
7 My salvation and my honor depend on God;
he is my mighty rock, my refuge.

Anxiety

I Peter 5:7

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

Philippians 4:6

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

Ask

John 14:13-14

13 And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son.**14** You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it.

John 15:7-8

7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. **8** This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

John 15:16

You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.

Matthew 21:22

If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer."

I John 3:22

and receive from him anything we ask, because we keep his commands and do what pleases him.

I John 5:14-15

Psalm 20:4

May he give you the desire of your heart and make all your plans succeed.

Romans 4:21

being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised.

John 16:23-24

Philippians 4:6

Hope in God

Romans 4:18 (Against all hope)

Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

Romans 4:21 (God is powerful to do what he has promised)

being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised.

God's perfect time

Exodus 23:29-30
